Reality

- Outsourced thinking
- New busywork
- Commoditized mediocrity

Privacy & Confidentiality

- Your prompts are training data
- Proprietary code in public models
- GDPR, HIPAA, SOC2

Every convenience has a cost.

Circular Automation

- Education: Teachers → GPT → Students → GPT → GPT evaluates
- Documentation: Al writes, Al summarizes, no one reads
- Emails: 3 paragraphs for a 1-sentence message
- Cover letters: applicants don't remember applying
- Software: <insert expletives>
- Spam and Scam: bug bounty program.

We automated the appearance of work.

The Resource Crisis

- Energy: GPT-4 training ≈ 50 GWh
- Water: Millions of litres for cooling
- RAM: Samsung can't supply itself Al bought it all
- Hardware: GPUs, rare earth, e-waste

Every query has a carbon footprint.

The Absurdities of technology.

- WiFi toasters, Al washing machines, juicers have an app.
- Blog posts written by GPT, summarized by Google.
- Chatbots talking to chatbots.
- Prompts masquerading as art.

Neural Atrophy

Arithmetic calculators freed us for higher math.

The Commodification Trapo

- Artist → Craftsman → Imitator → Commodity
- Why do we not like the newer Marvel movies?

"I want AI to do my laundry so I can do art. Not AI to do my art so I can do laundry." Have we got it backwards?

Principles

- 1. Human Accountability Someone owns the output. Always.
- **2. The IO Monad Rule** Pure functions \rightarrow automate. Side effects \rightarrow human checkpoint.
- 3. The Code Rule at Essenita "No line of code in your PR you can't explain."
